It is against the law to discriminate against anyone because of their sex, religion, disability or certain other personal characteristics ('protected characteristics')

A person is victimised where s/he is subjected to a detriment because it is believed (whether rightly or wrongfully) that s/he has done, or may do, something to assert the rights of a disabled person (eg making an allegation against someone, or bringing anti-discrimination proceedings, or giving evidence and provide information in such proceedings).

Poor care and support can breach the rights of people with dementia and carers to not be treated in an inhuman or degrading way, the right to respect for private and family life and the right to liberty. Your right not to be discriminated against The Human Rights Act protects you from discrimination in connection with your human rights under the Act. This means your human rights mustn ' t be breached or protected differently because of certain things like sex, disability and race. This protection is wider than that of the Equality Act 2010.

Protecting your human rights when using health and care ...

The Equality Act 2010 says that you must not be discriminated against because: you are (or are not) a certain age or in a certain age group someone thinks you are (or are not) a specific age or age group, this is known as discrimination by perception

Every woman, man, youth and child has the human right to freedom from discrimination based on gender, race, ethnicity, sexual orientation or any other status, and to other fundamental human rights dependent upon realization of the human right to freedom from discrimination. This includes not discriminating against you, which is protected in UK law through the Human Rights Act 1998.
